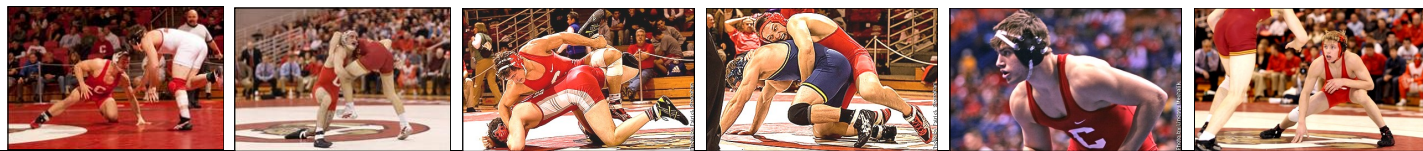
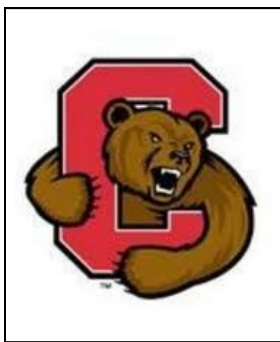

197: Cam Simaz had 32 bonus point victories last year, often exhausting his opponents completely by the start of the third period. He was third at nationals in 2010 and should finish a few spots higher this time around.

165: Those who know Justin Kerber's history on this team may be surprised that he will be at the same weight for the second consecutive year. It took a while for him to adjust to the 165 weight class as a junior, but he really

285: The only thing I am certain of when it comes to Oney Snyder, Stryker Lane, Maciej Jochym and Lukasz Stala is that we have four very good big men with four very strange names. Whoever survives the room and breaks out as the starter will be nationally competitive in time for our March title run.

The Big Red wrestling team is excited to welcome the recruiting Class of 2014, which has been recognized as one of the best in the country (third by WIN magazine, fourth by TheOpenMat.com and D1CollegeWrestling.net and eighth by InterMat). The group represents eight different weight classes and six states.

## Meet the Class of 2014



Michael Alexander (174 pounds, Findlay, OH/Findlay) - Alexander took second place at 171 pounds at the Ironman tournament in his senior year. He was a two-time Ohio state placewinner, finishing seventh and fifth. During his high school career, he broke or tied at least five team records, including most takedowns in a season and career, most pins in a season and career and most wins in a season. Alexander also played football at Findlay, earning second team All-League honors in his last campaign.

Jace Bennett (174/184 pounds, Amarillo, TX/Randall) - Bennett was a Texas state champion and three-time state medalist, also finishing second and fourth. Bennett also reached the podium twice at NHSCA Nationals, taking sixth at 160 as a junior and eighth at 189 as a senior. He also was the 2009 189 pound champion at the Toshiba Midwest Classic.

Matthew Cunningham (174 pounds, Pittsburgh, PA/Shady Side Academy) - Cunningham was a three-time Pennsylvania state medalist, winning the 171 pound state championship as a senior after second and fifth place finishes in previous years. The four-time WPIAL champion was selected to represent Pennsylvania at the Dapper Dan Wrestling Classic in 2010. Cunningham was a two-time Powerade finalist, winning the event in 2008, and a two-time Ironman placewinner.



Ryan Dunphy (141/149 pounds, Little Falls, NJ/Passaic Valley) - Dunphy was the NHSCA Junior Nationals runner up in 2009 and a third place medalist at the New Jersey state championships at 140 pounds. He won four district titles and two regional championships and his 156 victories are the most ever for a Passaic County wrestler.

Billy George (197 pounds, Long Branch, NJ/Long Branch) - George was a two-time NHSCA Nationals

champion, earning the title as both a junior and a senior at 189 pounds. One of InterMat's top 100 recruits, George took fourth at Beast of the East and twice placed third at the New Jersey state tournament. He was also a starter at linebacker and running back in football, earning division Co-Defensive Player of the Year honors in his final season.



Brett Hernandez-Henderson (125 pounds, Lake Elsinore, CA/Temescal Canyon) - Hernandez-Henderson was a four year starter who won a league title as a senior. He finished third at the CIF Southern in 2010 and served as team captain.



Josh Kennedy (125 pounds, Norman, OK/Norman North) - Kennedy won an Oklahoma state title in his final high school season at 125 pounds, after finishing third at 103 as a sophomore. He was the first-ever state champion from his high school. Kennedy placed fifth at the Toshiba Midwest Classic at 119 pounds as a senior.



Marshall Peppelman (165 pounds, Harrisburg, PA/Central Dauphin) - Peppelman, a three-time Pennsylvania state champion (and four time finalist), was ranked as one of the top four recruits in the country. He was a three-time champion at the Beast of the East tournament, one of two wrestlers to ever win the Powerade four times and a two-time Super 32 winner. Peppelman was chosen as a member of the Wrestling USA/Cliff Keen 2010 High School Dream Team and to the Dapper Dan Wrestling Classic. He was undefeated for the final two years of his high school career and had an overall 173-7 record. His brother, Walter, wrestles at Harvard.



Jesse Shanaman (157/165 pounds, Blairstown, NJ/Blair Academy) - Shanaman, a three-time National Preps medalist, was one of InterMat's top 100 recruits. He was a finalist at several top events his senior year, winning the Beast of East title while taking runner up at Ironman and NHSCA Senior Nationals at 152 pounds. He also won the Bethlehem Holiday Classic. His brother, Zack, wrestled at Penn.

## Big Red Welcomes Acclaimed Class of 2014 (Continued)



Chris Villalonga (149/157 pounds, Totowa, NJ/Blair Academy) – Villalonga, ranked as one of the top four recruits in the nation, was one of the most decorated wrestlers in the history of the Blair program. He won the National Preps tournament four times and was a three-time winner (and four-time finalist) at the Beast of the East and Ironman events. Villalonga was selected to the Wrestling USA/Cliff Keen 2010 High School Dream Team as well as the Dapper Dan Wrestling Classic, where he was named Most Outstanding Wrestler. He capped off his 145-3 career by winning NHSCA Senior Nationals at 140 pounds. He did not lose a match in his last three years of high school competition.

Also joining the Big Red are several wrestlers who competed with Finger Lakes Wrestling Club last season.



Craig Eifert (149/157 pounds, Mason, MI/Mason) - Eifert was a three-time Michigan state champion for Mason and an NHSCA Nationals All-American, finishing sixth as a senior. In 2009-10, he placed third at the

Buffalo Open and was the runner up at the East Stroudsburg Open at 149 pounds.



Mike Nevinger (141 pounds, Perry, NY/Letchworth Central) - Nevinger was a two-time New York state champion in high school. He earned NHSCA All-American honors three times, finishing fifth as a sophomore and fourth as a junior and senior. In 2009-10, Nevinger finished second at the Buffalo and ESU Opens and took third at the National Collegiate and Edinboro Opens.

Joe Stanzone (133 pounds, Dingmans Ferry, PA/Blair Academy) - Stanzone was a two-time National Preps runner up at Blair Academy and took third place at NHSCA Senior Nationals. In 2009-10, he earned fourth at the Buffalo Open and third at the Binghamton and ESU Opens. In the summer of 2010, he placed seventh at University Nationals in freestyle.

Jake Arnone (174 pounds) and Pete Mesko (184 pounds) were teammates at Honesdale High School in Pennsylvania. They wrestled in several tournaments last year, including the Buffalo, ESU and Nittany Lion Opens.

The Cornell wrestling team will look to win its fifth straight championship at the 107th EIWA tournament March 5-6 at Sojka Pavilion on the campus of Bucknell. Wrestling begins at 10 a.m. on March 5. The finals are at 3 p.m. on March 6.

The 2009-2010 season was the best in Cornell history, capped off with a second place finish at the NCAA tournament. The Big Red also crowned an NCAA individual champion for the third straight year in freshman Kyle Dake at 141 pounds, had four wrestlers reach All-American status for the sixth consecutive year and won their fourth EIWA title in a row.

Although the season began with a tough 18-17 home loss to Maryland, the Big Red had several highlight wins against the Terrapins. Sophomore Frank Perrelli got Cornell off to a strong start with a decision at 125 pounds. Then, in his first dual meet in front of his hometown crowd, Dake turned a third period deficit against returning All-American Alex Krom into an 8-3 victory with the help of a huge five-point move. Junior Mack Lewnes also reaffirmed that he was a strong national contender at his new weight of 174 pounds by trouncing #4 ranked Mike Letts by technical fall, 18-3. Adding victories for Cornell were freshman Steve Bosak (184) and junior Corey Manson (149).



The following day, Cornell hosted the Body Bar Invitational. Perrelli and Lewnes won titles for the Big Red, which placed second as a team behind Kent State. Perrelli defeated nationally ranked Michael Martinez of Wyoming in the finals while Lewnes again topped Letts to win the championship. Sophomore Cam Simaz was the runner up at 197 pounds. Placing third for Cornell were junior Mike Grey at 133 pounds and Bosak, while DJ Meagher and sophomore George Kocher finished fourth at 157 and 197, respectively. Also reaching the podium in fifth place for the Big Red were seniors Nate Holley at 184 and Taylor Moore at heavyweight.

The team then took its first road trip of the year to Nevada for the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational. Despite missing several starters, Cornell was the tournament runner up by one point to Ohio State. Leading the way was Lewnes, who cruised to the 174 pound title. Grey also made the finals, losing a close match to All-American Boris Novachkov. After a quarterfinal loss, Simaz stormed through the wrestlebacks, picking up two falls and a tech on his way to third. Bosak and Perrelli took fifth while Dake placed fourth. The two close overtime losses suffered by Dake would turn out to be his only setbacks of the season.

Following three weeks off from competition, the squad traveled to North Carolina for the Southern Scuffle. Cornell defended its team title with three individual champions and five other medalists. Dake blitzed his way to the final without surrendering a single point before beating highly-ranked Mike Thorn of Minnesota in the final. Dake trailed 4-2 entering the third period but reversed Thorn to tie the score and rode him out to win on the riding time point. Lewnes similarly dominated all his opponents, with three falls and a major before scoring a decisive 6-1 triumph over returning All-American Chris Henrich in the championship match. Lewnes was named the Outstanding Wrestler of the tournament. Simaz won all of his bouts by bonus points, including a major decision in the finals over Ohio's Erik Schuth.



In his first action of the season, senior Troy Nickerson stormed into the Scuffle finals before injury defaulting to take second. In addition to Nickerson, two other wrestlers returned to the mat after a layoff, with senior heavyweight Josh Arnone taking sixth and junior Justin Kerber placing fifth in his debut at 165 pounds. Grey grabbed third and Bosak earned fifth.



Cornell began 2010 with a trip to Cedar Falls, Iowa for the NWCA/Cliff Keen National Duals. The Big Red began by defeating Wisconsin, 24-11. Perrelli, Grey, Dake, senior John Basting (157), Simaz and Arnone all won by decision while Lewnes won by fall. Grey and Simaz both beat highly regarded opponents, with Grey topping #6 Tyler Graff and Simaz besting #10 Trevor Brandvold.

# Looking Back at the Outstanding Cornell

In the next round, Ohio State beat the Big Red despite a big win by Dake over the nation's top ranked wrestler, Reece Humphrey, as well as victories by Grey, Lewnes and Simaz. In the consolation bracket, Cornell won two duals in a row, first beating Missouri 23-15 and then getting revenge on Maryland with a 19-15 victory. Boise State then edged the Big Red 20-19, resulting in a sixth place finish.

The National Duals weekend propelled Dake to the #1 ranking in the nation after he went 5-0 against formidable opponents. Lewnes (4-0) and Simaz (4-0) also went unbeaten while Grey went 4-1 against several strong wrestlers, including a major decision over All-American Steve Bell.

After three tough events on the road, Cornell returned to Ithaca to renew its dual rivalry with Le-



high. Each team won 5 matches by decision as the meet resulted in a 15-15 tie. Getting their hands raised for the Big Red were Nickerson, Grey, Dake, Kerber and Lewnes. In an exciting bout, Kerber was behind with just seconds remaining in the third when Mountain Hawk Brandon Hatchett was called for stalling for the second time, deadlocking the match. Kerber then got the win in sudden victory with a takedown.

The following day, Cornell hosted the New York State Championships, an event the Big Red easily won. Perrelli, Grey, junior Colin McDonald (174), Simaz and Taylor Moore won their weights. Kerber and Holley finished in the runner up position while Manson claimed third and Basting took fourth.

In late January, Iowa State visited Ithaca for a special dual. Although the Cyclones won 24-13, over 4,200 fans watched as the late Cornell wrestler Adam Frey was honored. For each attendee in the stands, a donation was



made to the Adam Frey Foundation. In addition, Cornell welcomed four new members into the Hall of Distinguished Wrestling Alumni, Mark Ferguson '93, Gene Nighman '81, Dale Porter '75 and Patrick Welsh '85. On the mat, Nickerson provided one of the highlights for the home team with a first period pin over #5 Andrew Long. Lewnes won in dominant fashion again while Dake earned a victory as well.

Cornell then completed its regular season with six overpowering dual victories over its five Ivy foes (Brown, Columbia, Harvard, Penn, Princeton) and Hofstra. The Big Red outscored the competition 241-25 combined in these meets and clinched their eighth consecutive Ivy League title.

Lewnes reached two milestones during this portion of the schedule. He became the 12<sup>th</sup> wrestler in school history to notch 100 career wins when he defeated Penn's Scott Giffin. A week later, Lewnes broke the team's career falls record when he earned his 38<sup>th</sup> pin against Brown's Jack Roberts. He currently stands ninth in Big Red history in victories with 111 and first in falls with 40.

It was no surprise that eight Cornellians earned First-Team All-Ivy honors: Nickerson, Grey, Dake, Manson, Kerber, Lewnes, Simaz and Arnone. All went undefeated during Ancient Eight competition. Bosak was named to the Second Team.

Lewnes captured Ivy Wrestler of the Year honors for the second year in a row while Dake was named Ivy Rookie of the Year. It marked the sixth consecutive year that a member of the Big Red won Rookie of the Year honors. After the season ended, Dake was also named EIWA Freshman of the Year and Freshman of the Year by Inter-mat and Amateur Wrestling News.

## Wrestling 2009-2010 Campaign (Continued)

In March, the squad headed to Bethlehem, Pennsylvania looking to win the EIWA crown for the fourth straight time. While some expected Lehigh to challenge the Big Red for the title, Cornell dominated from the start, piling up bonus point wins early and often. The Big Red outscored runner up Penn by 47.5 points and five Cornellians won championships: Nickerson, Grey, Dake, Lewnes and Simaz. It was the third EIWA crown for both Nickerson and Lewnes and the second for Simaz. All five champions automatically qualified for NCAAs, along with Kerber and Arnone who each took third and Bosak, who was fourth. Manson placed eighth.



Cornell also captured three individual awards. The Coaches Award for Outstanding Wrestler went to Lewnes and the Fletcher Award for

most team points scored at EIWAs during a career was presented to Nickerson. The David Dunlop '59 Head Coach of Wrestling Rob Koll was named 2010 EIWA Coach of the Year. In late March, he was also voted Interim's Coach of the Year nationally.

In the final event of the year, Cornell traveled to Omaha for the NCAA championships. Two wrestlers, Dake and Lewnes, earned top seeds at their weights, with Nickerson, Simaz and Grey also receiving seeds.

Cornell once again boasted four All-American wrestlers – Dake, Lewnes, Simaz and Nickerson. Dake capped off an excellent rookie campaign with a national championship, the first for a true freshman in five years. Dake followed Jordan Leen (157 pounds, 2008) and Nickerson (125 pounds, 2009) atop the NCAA podium. He demonstrated his dominating top wrestling and fantastic neutral

defense in his finals triumph over Iowa's Montell Marion and throughout the tournament. Lewnes earned his second All-American honor with his runner up finish. His outstanding junior year, in which he was taken down only twice, concluded with a record of 40-1. He will be among the favorites for the Hodge Trophy in 2011. Simaz had three bonus point wins on his way to the third place match against Maryland's Hudson Taylor. Taylor had won their first

three meetings, twice by fall. However, Simaz grabbed third place with a quick takedown in sudden victory and claimed his second All-American finish. Nickerson battled through his severe shoulder injuries to finish his stellar career as a four-time All-American. After an upset loss in the second round, he was able to bounce back through the pain to win five straight matches, including two pins. He took fourth, ending his time in a Cornell singlet with finishes of first, second, third and fourth at NCAAs.

Grey, Kerber and Bosak were all one match from All-American status. Grey went 3-2 at the tournament and reached 100 wins with his first round victory. He currently claims 102 wins, 13<sup>th</sup> on the all-time Cornell list. Kerber avenged an earlier season major decision loss to All-American Nick Marable with a convincing 7-4 triumph, before a controversial reversal call at the buzzer in overtime ended his postseason run. After a first round loss, Bosak won three straight, including two falls (one over two-time All-American Louis Caputo).

Arnone dropped two close matches at heavyweight to close out his career. However, he fought through injuries throughout his years in Ithaca to earn All-American status in 2007 and provided leadership as a senior team captain, along with Nickerson.

Cornell scored 90 points and earned the NCAA silver trophy for second place, the best finish in school history. As Coach Koll said after NCAAs, "Next year we should be ranked in the preseason as the #1 team in the country, and I fully expect to end the season in the same position." With six of seven point scorers from the NCAA tournament back, in addition to other contributors and a strong freshman class, 2010-11 should be a very exciting season for Cornell wrestling.
